boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put
out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and
taught the crowds from the boat. ⁴ When he had finished
speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water
and let down your nets for a catch.'⁵ Simon answered,
'Master, we have worked all night long but have caught
nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.'
⁶When they had done this, they caught so many fish that
their nets were beginning to break. ⁷ So they signalled to

their partners in the other boat to come and help them.
